Dear Grace Members and Friends,

Last Sunday, Pastor Tracey kicked off our sermon series on discipleship as she preached on what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ in the 21st century. This Sunday we are going to look at discipleship through a different lens. What we will be discussing this Sunday is almost hard for me to put into words. And while a discussion that's hard to define sounds like a recipe for sermon-writing disaster, hear me out. You know how difficult experiences and feelings can change us? They can lead us to doubt ourselves. They can weaken us or lead us to fear. Yet, difficulties can also lead us to places of great depth, strength, love, and faith. This is especially true if we face life's challenges together; and even more so if we know that the someone standing next to us has faced a similar path or similar pain.

Maybe it's hard to define, but I know this reality is true because I've personally experienced it on more than one occasion: There is something profoundly powerful when a neighbor walks through the storm with me. It leads to greater depths of faith, love, and belief that the image of God exists within each and every one of my neighbors. It makes Christ's love for me more visible and my desire to share his love with the world more of a priority.

Something changes within us when we carry the burdens of one another, when we're vulnerable, and when we offer each other hope. It illumines the love of Christ in our world. So how do we do it? It sounds pretty radical to be vulnerable in a world full of high walls and facades. So just how, exactly, do we practically disciple in such a way? And what can Paul's super short letter to this guy named Philemon from 2,000 years ago teach us about our faith today? Join us at 9 a.m. and 11:05 a.m. as we worship together and learn about the importance of vulnerability as disciples of Jesus Christ.
