This Sunday, the first Sunday in Lent, is when we start our sermon series on The Red Words, those words Jesus said while he walked the earth. Adam Hamilton, in his book The Message of Jesus, reminds us that the four Gospels record over forty thousand words that Jesus spoke. "Accounting for duplicates, where the same saying appears in more than one Gospel, we have approximately twenty-five thousand unique words of Jesus. While the gospels emphasize the crucifixion and resurrection as the climax of Jesus' life and ministry, they clearly believed his words matter." Simon Peter said to Jesus, "You have the words of eternal life" (John 6:68).

If we want to follow Jesus today, it's not enough to know that he is our Savior, who died and rose again. We must know that he is Lord and that what he taught us must be embraced and used to guide our daily lives.

We start this week with one of Jesus' earliest teachings. He said, "The kingdom of God has come near" (Mark 1:15). What does that mean? Where is the kingdom of God and what does it look like? What is our part in it? Join us this Sunday at 9am and 11:05am as we worship God enthusiastically.
